

One Dance UK Awards 2020 - Championing the dance sector across the UK

Terms & Conditions for Awards nominations, judging and selection.

1. General

1. The One Dance UK Awards are set-up to champion and celebrate the talented, inspiring and skilled professionals and leading organisations that work in dance in the United Kingdom

1.1. The principles of the One Dance UK Awards are:

1.1.1. That shortlisted nominees exemplify good professional practice in their specialist fields and within their respective categories.

1.1.2. That any organisation or individual can be nominated, provided they meet the criteria set out in the general criteria of the award-specific nomination form and those outlined in point 3.

1.1.3. That no-one be discriminated against based on their gender, ethnicity, age (see exceptions in point 3.1.2), sexuality, disability or socio-economic background.

1.1.4. That One Dance UK does not seek to identify the 'best' in any category, but to recognise and champion achievement across the sector.

1.1.5. Being nominated for, or given, an award does not provide a qualification, endorsement or specific recommendation. It demonstrates that the selection panel considered the candidate to have demonstrated sufficient good practice/evidence to warrant receiving an award for their work.

2. Nominations

2.1. Nominations can be received between the dates listed publicly on the website only. There is no guarantee that nominations received after this date will be included.

2.1.1. One Dance UK reserves the right to reopen nominations for a limited time once the formal deadline has passed.

2.1.2. One Dance UK reserves the right to remove any category that does not receive an appropriate number of eligible nominations. In this instance, those who have made a nomination will be contacted and invited to submit a nomination for another category if they wish.

2.2. Anyone can submit a nomination for a person or organisation for any award, except in the following circumstances:

2.2.1. They or the organisation in which they are employed, has sponsored the award. They can still nominate someone for a different award.

- 2.2.2. They are on the Selection Panel or are directly related to someone on the Selection Panel via either a personal relationship (defined as immediate family member, i.e. a parent, or spouse) or a close working relationship (defined as a line-manager, employer or recruiter, for example).
- 2.3. People working in the sector, including teachers, can nominate themselves for an award, unless they are an employee of One Dance UK.
- 2.4. Organisations can nominate themselves for an organisational award.
- 2.5. There is no upper or lower age limit to a person making a nomination.
- 2.6. People can make more than one nomination for any given award category.
- 2.7. A nominee can be submitted for more than one award category.
- 2.8. Nominations cannot be made anonymously. Basic information about the nominator and how they know the nominee must be supplied.
- 2.9. Nominations can be made by anyone regardless of their location.
- 2.10. Nominations can only be made via the online portal. Nominations received in any other format will not be accepted.
- 2.11. The volume of nominations will not be taken into account during the judging process, except in the instance of votes which are open to the public.

3. General Criteria

- 3.1. To be eligible for nomination, an individual must:
 - 3.1.1. Be anyone living within England, Northern Ireland, Scotland or Wales.
 - 3.1.2. Be at least 18 years old at the time of nomination, unless otherwise stated.
 - 3.1.3. Not hold any cautions or convictions relating to offences, which mean they are listed on the Disclosure and Barring Service Barred Lists (Children) or equivalent in Scotland and Northern Ireland.
- 3.2. To be eligible for nomination, an organisation must:
 - 3.2.1. Be based and carry out at least 90% of its work in England, Wales, Scotland and/or Northern Ireland.

4. Specific Category Criteria

- 4.1. To avoid any potential conflict of interest or the risk of certain Awards appearing biased towards teachers connected with a specific Awarding Body, the following awards are not available to be sponsored by Dance Awarding Bodies which train teachers to deliver specific syllabi.
 - 4.1.1. Rising Star Award

4.1.2. Inspirational Community Dance Practitioner Award

4.1.3. Inspirational Work in Education Award

4.2. One Dance UK reserves the right to remove any nomination that does not provide an appropriate level of detail in its submission. This nominee will subsequently not be listed in the public 'long-list' of those who've received a nomination.

5. Selection and Prize Giving

5.1. The nominees will be shortlisted by a panel of relevant specialists appointed by One Dance UK.

5.2. The short-listing panel will also make the decision as to who should be the recipient of each Award.

5.3. In the instance of a publicly voted award, One Dance UK reserves the right to consult the relevant panel of judges in: the event of a tied vote; the event that the difference in percentage of the vote is less than 1% between nominees; other circumstances that may call into reasonable doubt the validity of the public vote.

5.4. No correspondence between the Selection Panel, those that nominate or nominees, will take place prior to the decision being made.

5.5. Formal feedback will not be provided to shortlisted nominees unless requested, and at the discretion of those on the judging panel.

5.6. One Dance UK reserves the right not to award any particular award in any given category.

5.7. All shortlisted nominees will be invited to attend the awards event. Nominees can send a representative in their place to the awards ceremony; this would need to be agreed in writing at the latest of one (1) week before the prize-giving date, and ideally no less than two (2) weeks.

5.8. The awards ceremony will take place in November 2020 in the UK. This is the only guaranteed opportunity for a live presentation of the Award.

5.9. The attendees will be asked to provide media consent for their photographs to be taken and used by One Dance UK and sponsorship partners in promotional print, online marketing and social media.

5.10. The attendees will be asked to provide information for One Dance UK to use during the ceremony, which should be provided by the date provided within the invitation and subsequent correspondence.

5.10.1. This may include, and is not limited to, information on dietary requirements and accessibility needs, headshots or images, biographies and personal contact details of guests.

5.10.2. One Dance UK will be as accommodating as possible regarding content and information that comes through past the final deadline. However, any information or content that comes through past this date has no guarantee of being used and/or submitted where relevant.

5.11. The prize will consist of:

5.11.1. An engraved trophy specific to the award, the award sponsor and the award recipient.

5.11.2. For individuals, a basic individual membership. Awardees will have the option to include add-ons, such as the Performance Optimisation Package, at an additional cost.

5.11.3. For organisations, complimentary advertising will be offered as part of One Dance UK's publications or website.

5.12. There is no cash prize, or cash alternative to the prize.

5.13. Any award that is not collected on the night will be sent by post to the address provided by the shortlisted nominee.

5.13.1. In an instance where the shortlisted nominee has not provided an address, One Dance UK will endeavour to secure the appropriate address, including using the addresses submitted on the nomination forms.

6. Communications and Data.

6.1. One Dance UK will publicise those who received an eligible nomination through digital communications and press as our 'long-list' of nominations.

6.1.1. One Dance UK will not individually contact those who are listed on the 'long-list'.

6.2. One Dance UK will contact all those who are shortlisted via the contact details we are provided on the nomination forms.

6.2.1. If required, One Dance UK may combine information provided with information available within the public realm to acquire the appropriate contact details for shortlisted nominees, especially in the instance that details provided are incorrect or unresponsive.

6.3. The One Dance UK Marketing & Communications team will use information provided to publicise the awards and those who have been shortlisted.
